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### MEETING TOPICS AND DISCUSSIONS

#### **LEADERSHIP CHANGES** *Status update:*

**Welcome:** Dr Paul Murphy is the Doctors of BC representative for Vancouver Coastal Health, replacing Dr Ka Wai Cheung (FEWG Co-Chair)

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#### **PROVINCIAL ENGAGEMENT APPLICATION** *Funding*

*proposal review:* Five provincial funding applications were received. The SSC FEWG conducted a pre-review of the applications in advance, allowing for more informed and efficient discussions during the meeting. Each application was discussed collectively, with the goal of ensuring group consensus and fair consideration and alignment with established criteria before final decisions were made. Two provincial engagement projects were approved:

- **General Practitioner Oncology (GPO) Community Oncology Network (CON) Site Liaison positions in four Health Authorities.** (Approved funding: \$35.6K)  
*Purpose: Funding for 5 liaison positions in Island, North, Vancouver Coastal, Interior (2)*
- **Civility Matters Provincial Spread.** (Approved funding \$51.6K)  
*Purpose: Funding to support physician and health authority champions for Civility Matters campaign at pilot sites across regions, developing training materials, provincial meetings, consultant support*

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#### **QUALITY IMPROVEMENT WORKING GROUP (QIWG)**

*Update Review and discussion:* A strategic planning workshop took place on February 18-19, 2026, with QIWG members, 6 health authority Physician Quality Improvement (PQI) program leads and system leaders. Discussion around challenges in the system, and the model of adaptive leadership took place. QIWG continues to advance discussions around Quality Planning at health authority steering committees.

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#### **FE VIRTUAL SHOWCASE** *Review and discussion:*

Planning for the [FE Virtual Showcase](#) on June 10th, 2026, is underway. This Showcase will provide an opportunity to share successes highlighted in MSAs' Annual Review submissions from across the province. The evening will include engagement and connection, Lightning Talk presentations, and appreciation. Discussions and voting took place around priority topics for Showcase presentations, which included:

- Physician Health and Wellness
